New Project in Development: MACRO (working title)

This new project is an investigation into bringing light to some of the unnoticed wonders that happen in and around us. Where our previous self-titled show 'Fauna', was a dive into the more primal facets of animals/humans, this time we will be zooming into ourselves and our place in the natural environment. We will use a magnifying glass to delve into the smaller wonders the natural world provides for us, giving gentle reminders of its medicinal and cathartic nature.

Creative Pictures and Ideas

The stage is a surreal habitat of life, transforming and growing. Some things magnified, others zoomed out, scale and size exist differently here.

Someone dances on their hands, a skirt defies gravity: it is puppeteered from the ceiling, moving the dance of its master. It is unclear who holds these reigns. The skirt becomes the set and the unicycle wheel transforms into legs, technological advancement in its beauty and unease.





A human sized fungus comes alive to dance, growing as if on time-lapse. The surrealism slowly transitions into more familiar surroundings, where we can recognise ourselves and human behaviours.

Martial Arts movement fills the stage, busy and fast choreography of people and pathways. The lights slowly fade to expose only a face and a hand. Soon enough the lights grow and the choreography continues just as it had before.

That moment was always there, however small and subtle and unnoticed in comparison to the throws and jumps and levels which change so rapidly. Both natural cycles and created routines are explored, can they work harmoniously?

This show aims to be a ceremony, medicinal in the sense that it evokes curiosity, feeds the spirit, and the absurdity intends to be transformative. Chaos, beauty and humour thrive together on this stage, the space we invite you all into, exploring the patchwork fabric of coexistence with nature.




